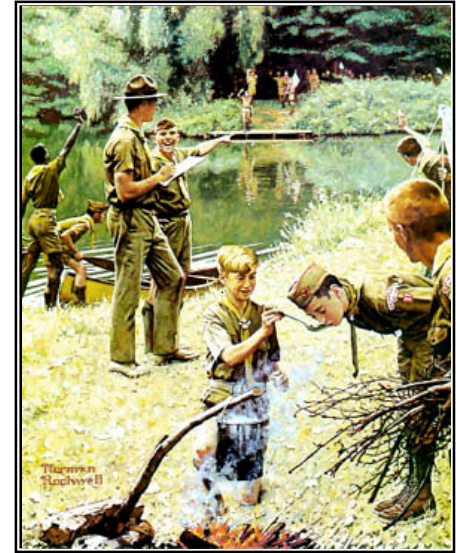

Frequently Asked Questions (Cont'd)

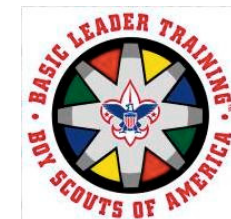
7. Who will be teaching the course?

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What does the Course Fee pay for?
The Course Fee covers the cost of Food, Course Materials, Insurance, and usage of Camp Jackson.
2. How do I register?
Fill out the registration form and send it to the address provided along with your payment of 25.00 dollars.
3. Why do you need my email address?
To keep the cost of mailings down to a minimum, we prefer to send you course information via email. If you do not have an email address, we will send you the information by postal mail.
4. Who should attend this course?
The training applies to adult troop leaders, Varsity Scout and Venturing Leaders, 2nd Year Webelos Scout Leaders and anyone else who needs to teach or learn the Outdoor Skills required of a Scout.
5. How does Outdoor Leader Skills work?
Upon arrival, you’ll be assigned to a Patrol. Through the remainder of the course you’ll learn the outdoor skills within Patrol and Troop settings.
6. What do you mean by Hands-On?
The Skills will be demonstrated and then you will have an opportunity to become comfortable with each skill, working in patrols or in troop settings.
